### Sign up NOW for School Year 2025-2026 implementation

All elementary schools are encouraged to implement Pennsylvania's Kindergarten Entry Inventory (PA KEI) in the 2025-2026 school year to assist in meeting federal requirements.

PA KEI is a reliable reporting tool that offers teachers an instructional strategy for understanding and tracking a student's proficiency at kindergarten entry. The PA KEI is available to all local education agencies (LEAs) at no cost.

The PA KEI collects information on a consistent set of standards-based indicators across the Commonwealth. The PA KEI is based on Pennsylvania's Learning Standards for Early Childhood and the Pennsylvania Core Standards. PA KEI includes 30 indicators and provides a comprehensive profile that includes the domains of: Social and Emotional Development; English Language Arts; Mathematics; Approaches to Learning; and Health, Wellness and Physical Development. PA KEI is intended to be used by kindergarten teachers to record a student's demonstration of skills within the first 45 calendar days of the kindergarten year. The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) provides opportunities to strengthen the contribution of high-quality early childhood education in school reform and improvement efforts. The law

recognizes that school success starts before a student enters the K-12 setting and calls on states to describe how they will assist LEAs and elementary schools to collaborate with early childhood education programs, and to invest in evidence-based practices.

ESSA supports early learning and LEA collaboration in three main ways: (1) expanding access to high-quality early learning; (2) encouraging alignment and collaboration from birth through third grade; and (3) supporting educators. The PA KEI is a tangible tool to assist LEAs in understanding the comprehensive learning strengths and needs of students entering the K-12 setting, establishing common expectations and language for beginning and extending collaborative conversations with pre-kindergarten programs and families, and planning and implementing joint professional development opportunities that focus on strengthening evidence-based practices for young learners.

Implementing the PA KEI requires a Point of Contact (POC) who will serve as the liaison between LEA administrative staff, implementing kindergarten teachers, the Office of Child Development and Early Learning (OCDEL), and data systems staff. A dedicated POC ensures effective communication and implementation throughout the PA KEI process.

To initiate PA KEI participation in the 2025-2026 school year, send the POC name, email address, and phone number to **RA-PWOCDELKEI@pa.gov** by May 30, 2025.

All kindergarten teachers who have not previously participated must complete a required professional development online course and obtain a certificate of completion. Teachers with an expired proficient user certificate (more than five years since certification) must also complete the professional development online course. More information about taking the online course is available here.

Below is the tentative training schedule and timeline for participation:

- March-September: Required professional development online course available
- August-September: PA KEI systems professional development opportunities available
- By the start of school: Implementing kindergarten teachers must have a required professional development online course certificate of completion on file in order to gain systems access
- **45 calendar days from start of school:** Observation and evidence collection/scoring completed
- **60 calendar days from start of school:** Data submissions (student outcomes) **finalized** within data system.

#### **Professional Development Options**

All kindergarten teachers who have not previously participated in PA KEI implementation must complete the required professional development course to ensure fidelity of implementation, obtain a certificate of completion, and gain access into the web-based system.

Teachers who obtained a proficient user certificate since April 2020 do not need to repeat the professional development protocol as they are within the five-year window of completion.

Teachers who obtained a proficient user certificate prior to April 2020 will need to renew their certificate of completion by completing the revised online professional development course. These teachers have already been contacted via email by OCDEL staff.

All teachers, regardless of proficiency status, should review the PA KEI materials (Inventory and User Manual at minimum) each year. All resources can be found at www.kei-pa.org.

The professional development protocol consists of self-paced, asynchronous, online learning lessons, and a final knowledge check. After viewing each lesson, participants will take a 10-question final knowledge check and must score at least 80% to receive their proficient user certificate, which is valid for five years from the date of completion.

# The Power of Play: Investigating Student Success in Kindergarten Classrooms

A study, <u>The Power of Play: Investigating Student Success in Kindergarten Classrooms</u>, by Karyn Allee at Georgia's Mercer University suggests that academic rigor can go hand in hand with the stimulation and engagement that mark a playful classroom.

The study compared reading and math gains in two kindergarten classes. Both teachers followed the same curriculum but differed in their implementation styles. One hewed to a didactic approach, including assigned seating and limited chances for students to choose. The other pursued what the paper calls a "playful approach," with flexible seating and time for movement, music, play, and reading and math skills. Children in the more playful classroom made greater gains in reading and math.

## Kindergarten, Here I Come and Recipes for Readiness

The Kindergarten Here I Come activity guide and Recipes for Readiness help families prepare their child for kindergarten. Kindergarten Here I Come provides monthly learning activities, resources and information to help their preschool-age child.

Recipes for Readiness provides family-friendly activities to help develop skills that kindergarten teachers look for as children enter their classrooms. Activities are designed for children aged three to five and are aligned to Pennsylvania's learning standards for early childhood. Both are great resources to share with families during kindergarten registration.
